DEAR SUPPORTERS:

It is said that national parks are "America's best idea." We suggest that state parks, refuges, and other state lands and facilities are also great ideas – and great places. It is a joy to serve as a steward of those places and of the gifts generous donors give to purchase, maintain and add facilities for those places.

The South Dakota Parks and Wildlife Foundation is a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) supporting organization for the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks (GFP). Its work is to attract and manage charitable gifts that support GFP's mission of conserving the state's natural resources, especially wildlife and parks. Past donations have included land, conservation easements, and cash for over four dozen projects. The value of those gifts, most of which have been granted



to GFP, exceeds 21 million dollars. The Foundation has also attracted and facilitated a number of gifts made directly to GFP.

This report covers the most recent four years of the Foundation's 31 year history. During that time, the Foundation was more active than ever, gathering 28 percent of all the 5,000 gifts given during its history with a value of \$9,800,000.

In the last four years, the Foundation has focused on two major state park projects – financing for the Custer State Park Visitor Center and purchasing lands and building facilities at Good Earth State Park at Blood Run. Both projects were declared Outdoor Heritage priorities by Governor Dennis Daugaard in 2012 and both are located near the state's major population centers. The Custer State Park Visitor Center opened in the spring of 2016 and the Visitor Center at Good Earth will open in the spring of 2017. Recent land purchases at Good Earth have significantly enlarged the park; making trail expansion and other enhancements possible in the future.

At the same time, visionary donors continued to support the Foundation's work through the Friends of South Dakota Parks and Wildlife program. They also continued support for many other projects including Fort Sisseton State Park, the Outdoor Campuses, the Mickelson Trail, Tony Dean's Acres Memorial and Adams Homestead and Nature Preserve.

We thank all those who have invested in these great places through the South Dakota Parks and Wildlife Foundation. Your contributions have often been matched by the State of South Dakota and Department of Game, Fish and Parks dollars. Other gifts are solely responsible for some program or project. Either way, your gifts have leveraged astounding results.

This report celebrates these contributions and their objectives. Enjoy!

GOOD EARTH STATE PARK AT BLOOD RUN

The new Visitor Center is under construction and is scheduled for completion in the spring of 2017. Additionally, the road system, hiking trail development, tree planting and native prairie restoration are all progressing nicely.

When the Visitor Center is completed, it will feature a world-class film and abundant interpretive exhibits. An additional \$340,000 in donations is needed to complete this phase of development at Good Earth State Park. These additional donations are needed to put the finishing touches on the Visitor Center and to acquire additional lands that will expand recreational opportunities at the park.

DONOR PROFILE

JEFF AND KATIE SCHERSCHLIGT And their granddaughters

Jeff Scherschligt, a Sioux Falls businessman, and his wife Katie love the outdoors, nature and wildlife in South Dakota and passionately want to preserve and pass along these gifts to future generations.

They know that Good Earth State Park at Blood Run is a special place with an intriguing history and access to South Dakota's largest, rapidly expanding population base. But efforts to secure public ownership of this Blood Run National Landmark area languished until Jeff and others enthusiastically led both public and private stakeholders to combine their respective skills, advocacy and resources in a renewed effort to create a new public asset. The Scherschligts call this partnership and the park a "win-win for all!"

Scherschligt explains the role of the South Dakota Parks and Wildlife Foundation in facilitating a public/private partnership and creating the park:

Involvement in the Foundation is an opportunity to leverage the power of public and private resources to advocate and provide assets for impactful projects. The Foundation also provides an efficient means to stretch philanthropic dollars.

The capability of GFP and the vision of Governor Daugaard combined with the passion and entrepreneurial drive of the Foundation has created the first new state park of our generation and a dynamic setting and story that will serve young and old alike for centuries.

We are proud to contribute both our time and treasure to the Foundation and to the cause of Good Earth State Park at Blood Run.

PETER NORBECK OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTER

The Peter Norbeck Visitor Center had served as headquarters for Custer State Park visitors until the new Visitor Center was opened in 2016. The historic, stone building will be repurposed as an Outdoor Education Center. Educational programming will be expanded at this location and outdated natural history exhibits will be replaced. Interior and exterior improvements are also needed.

After the improvements are completed, this facility will better serve families, school groups and other visitors taking part in expanded educational programs and activities here. Repurposing the center will require \$500,000 in private donations to help fund the work. More information on the project budget and design are available from brownassociates@goldenwest.net.



RUSHMORE CONNECTOR TRAIL

Imagine the challenges and beauty of an approximately 15 mile trail extending from the George Mickelson Trail near Hill City to Mount Rushmore. Each year brings this dream closer to reality. Donations are being accepted but major fundraising has not yet begun for this project. The South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks is the initiating agency and the US Department of Agriculture Forest Service and National Park Service are also key players in moving the project forward.

An Environmental Impact Statement is currently being prepared and is expected to be completed in less than two years. Cost estimates and staging of the new trail will then be developed and major gifts will be solicited by both the Mt. Rushmore Society and the South Dakota Parks and Wildlife Foundation.

MICKELSON TRAIL BRIDGE REPAIR

Well over 100 bridges ease the way for hikers, bikers, and horses that use the Trail. Half of these bridges are over 20 years old and they are showing their age. Over 50 bridges are in need of substantial rehabilitation or replacement. The cost of an average bridge repair is about \$350 per lineal foot, and the cost to repair all of the bridges currently needing repair exceeds two million dollars. The Foundation's goal is to raise enough money to repair two or three bridges each summer.

JIM HERSRUD

Jim is an avid cyclist and the Mickelson Trail is the focus of his exercise and much of his social life. Fellow "Trekkers" are like family to Jim. Not only has Jim signed on for the annual 109 mile Mickelson Trail Trek for over a dozen years, but he invites friends from all over the world to join him. Many of his excursions become parties – like the "June birthdays" or "raspberries at Mystic Trailhead" – on Sundays with friends. Jim often expands his circle of friends with people he meets on his treks.

The love of the trail also reflects Jim's love of the outdoors and especially the Hills. He has a degree in zoology and notes that the trail winds through nearly all of the Hills' ecosystems.

So it is easy to understand why Jim makes frequent gifts to both the trail and to the South Dakota Parks and Wildlife Foundation through its Friends of Parks and Wildlife program. Jim has also recognized the Mickelson Trail in his will because it is one of the great places that has had a significant impact on his life.


